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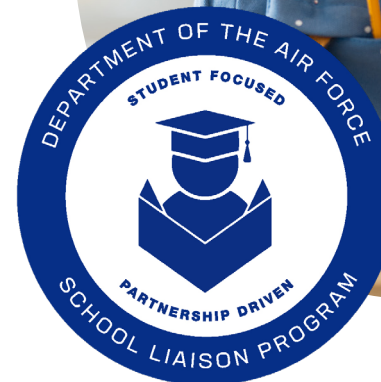

PUBLIC SCHOOLS Open Enrollment—allows parents to select a school in a different area, however it is the responsibility of the parent or legal guardian to transport the student to and from school.

PRIVATE SCHOOL is a choice for parents and there are school tuition organizations (STO's) that can assist with scholarships. Visit: www.schools.pima.gov/schools/private-schools for more information. CHARTER SCHOOLS are public, state-funded schools and cannot charge tuition. They receive state funding like those of the other Public School Districts. Charter schools contract with the state, or a district, to provide an education service. Charter schools were created to provide additional academic choices for parents and students.
